<p><b>Learning Objectives:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- I understand how words from a different language are used to make English words.</li> <li>- I am beginning to read and write in the Greek character set</li> </ul>		
<p><b>Summary of Activity:</b></p> <p><i>Session 1</i> Greek roots of the English language, historical context, word match-up exercise, mythical battle game</p> <p><i>Session 2</i> The Greek alphabet - practice writing with a reed pen, transliterate into Greek</p> <p><i>Session 3</i> Root words and transliteration - make a named <i>aegis</i></p>
